Guidelines for Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.



As we begin this Season of Lent, may it be a great opportunity to receive grace and grow in God's life, His life dwelling in us, that we might learn to rely on His power to save us. The Israelites were led into the desert and they preferred to go back to Egypt and be slaves rather than rely on God's grace to provide. We sometimes prefer to let the desires for comfort, health, power, pleasure, success, safety etc. rule our lives rather than rely on God's grace to provide. Jesus is led by the Spirit out into the desert and there He relies on God His Father to provide. He knows He is the Beloved Son of the Father. In Jesus, Psalm 91 is fulfilled: Because he clings to me, I will deliver him; I will set him on high because he acknowledges my name. He shall call upon me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in distress; I will deliver him and glorify him. (v. 14-15) Let us be one with Jesus in our temptations and trials and so experience His deliverance and glory. This Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday are the Ember Days of Lent. We might consider fasting each of these days and partial abstinence on Wednesday and Saturday in reparation for the over-indulgence of food and drink or the times we have misused God's gifts or taken them for granted. Also may our hearts abound with thanksgiving for the gifts of the season of spring that will soon be here. The Norbertine Fathers of St. Michael's Abbey are inviting the faithful to join them in prayer and daily fasting during the 40 Days of Lent, "In recent years, the focus of Lent has drifted from the ancient and worthy task of daily fasting.
