Blessed Advent Season!

I remember growing up in my family home we tried to light the candles of the Advent Wreath each week, though sometimes we were late setting it out—sometimes not finding it until the second week of Advent as it was packed away with the other Christmas decorations the previous year. Even though a little late setting it out some years, it served as a powerful reminder that this season is different—it is marked by waiting, joyful hope, and some penance though perhaps a little lighter than Lent. While we look forward to the Coming of Christ in glory and prepare to celebrate His First Coming, we are invited to be vigilant and pray as we hear in today's Gospel according to St. Luke:

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap. For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth. Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." Lk 21:34-36

I encourage you to find your Advent Wreaths today and set them on your kitchen table or your place of prayer in your home. Or if you do not have one, perhaps find a little greenery and 4 candles and make one. We could light the candles at home while we pray with the daily Gospel before or after supper. One way to pray is using the Ignatian way of praying called Meditation (see below). Or lighting the candles with the little children and praying the St. Andrew Novena Prayer (see below) from Nov. 30-Dec. 24 along with our usual daily or night prayers. Sincerely yours in Christ,
