A LIGHT of revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel. Luke 2:32

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. 40 days after the birth of our Lord, Joseph and Mary fulfilled the law of Moses concerning the dedication of the first-born son to God and also the mother's purification. They brought Jesus to the Temple and there He was recognized as the true Light, the hope of Israel and all the nations! World Day for Consecrated Life— In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted a day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life. Let us pray for our sisters and brothers, nuns and monks consecrated to the Lord especially today. Through their devotion to Christ and their living the evangelical counsels of poverty, chastity, and obedience they too offer the Church and the world a sign of hope as they remind us of our communion with God beginning now and finding its fulfillment in Heaven. "...through the many charisms of spiritual and apostolic life bestowed on them by the Holy Spirit, they have helped to make the mystery and mission of the Church shine forth, and in doing so have contributed to the renewal of society." <u>(St. John</u> <u>Paul II On the Consecrated Life and its Mission in the Church and in the World)</u>

Today is also called Candlemas Day as we bless candles today (and carry them in procession at the principal Mass), these candles become sacramentals reminding us that Jesus is the light of the world. Here is the Prayer for the blessing of Candles that the priest prays: O God, source and origin of all light, who on this day showed to the just man Simeon the Light for revelation to the Gentiles, we humbly ask that, in answer to your people's prayers, you may be pleased to sanctify with your blessing these candles, which we are eager to carry in praise of your name, so that treading the path of virtue, we may reach that light that never fails. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

This year let us ask the Holy Spirit to inspire us to try a new spiritual exercise and grow deeper in prayer and devotion (or recommit to one of our former good habits of prayer or spiritual reading). For example, lighting a blessed candle and praying with Sacred Scripture daily. Also there are many resources to help us, for example podcasts or videos such as <u>Rosary in a Year</u> or <u>Desert Fathers in a Year</u>. We might also consider the Nine First Friday devotion or Five First Saturday devotion. The Holy Father Pope Francis wrote <u>an encyclical on the Most Sacred Heart</u>, we could read that this month or on the First Fridays of the year. There are so many great resources on FORMED.ORG. Our parish has a subscription so you can access all the content on there for free.
