Guidelines for Lent: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.



Stations of the Cross. Fr. Hoesing will have Stations of the Cross this next Thursday, March 21st at 7:00pm in English.



Second Sunday of Lent

We ascend Mount Tabor today with Jesus and three of the Apostles. What will we learn on this mountain? Just before this passage, Jesus had just predicted His Passion and Death, "He said, "The Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed and on the third day be raised." (Lk 9:22) Moses and Elijah converse with Jesus about His exodus He would accomplish in Jerusalem. Father Gabriel of St. Mary Magdalene, O.C.D. in his work *Divine Intimacy* wrote, "The divine Master wished to teach His disciples in this way that it was impossible—for Him as well as for them—to reach the glory of the Transfiguration without passing through suffering. It was the same lesson that He would give later to the two disciples at Emmaus: "Ought not Christ to have suffered these things and so to enter into His glory? (Lk 24:26) This revelation, this ray of divine light coming forth from Jesus that they were blessed to behold, would give the disciples strength and encouragement to walk the way of the Cross.

May we receive these lessons anew today. We can ascend the mountain with our Lord especially in prayer. It is interesting the golden stand upon which the monstrance rests upon for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is called a Tabor. This reminds us how we can be with the Lord in Adoration and hear the Father speak to us, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." (Lk 9:35) The Lord Jesus will strengthen and encourage us that we may grow in generosity to endure suffering and the cross for love of Him.

During Lent, come up the mountain and join us for one of our weekly Thursday evening Parish Holy Hours at 7pm and or stop by the Church Sunday afternoons/evenings for some time with the Lord in Adoration. Or make a visit to the Church or the Adoration Chapel anytime that is convenient for you during the week. Also, there are two great opportunities for parish retreats this Lent. The Unbound Retreat will be held April 4-6, 2025 at St. Michael's Church in Hastings, NE. Fr. Bill Holoubek will lead the retreat, see the details on page 6 to register. St. Cecilia Church will host "Through His Words: A Lenten Scripture Parish Retreat" Saturday April 12, 7am-3pm. Fr. Gary Coulter, director of Our Lady of Good Counsel Retreat House in Waverly will share from his twelves years of experience in directing Ignatian Retreats, on how to hear God's voice in Sacred Scripture. On this silent day of reflection you can learn how to do an Ignatian Prayer period and will have quiet time to meditate on several Lenten scripture passages.
