What a grace to attend SEEK 25 in Salt Lake City January 1-5! I joined a group of about 40 parishioners from St. Cecilia, St. Michael, and St. Ann, college students from Hastings College Bronco Catholic, high school seniors from St. Cecilia, Sr. Xavier and Fr. Rowan. In the Gospel, St. John the Baptist speaks about how the Lord Jesus will baptize us with the Holy Spirit and fire— I experienced the Holy Spirit working and felt the love of the Holy Trinity in my heart as we joined some 18,000 other believers in worship of the true God at Mass and in Adoration, also, as we heard the inspiring talks and testimonies of different speakers as they shared on the themes of Relationship with God, Rebellion/Sin, Reconciliation, Re-Creation in Christ, and our Response to follow Jesus and live as His disciples. It really felt like a little taste of Heaven! I would like to share three moments that stand out for me. The first was at Mass as we joined the great number of faithful, some 800 priests and religious and about a dozen bishops, there was a beautiful realization of being part of something monumental—the story of the Incarnation is a personal story for each of us, it is a love story how God creates us in love and for love. He comes to save us in love! The second moment was when speaker, Hilary Draftz, invited all of us present for her talk to stand if we would like to receive that love anew, if we would like to say yes again (or for some, for the first time) to that love and give Jesus our whole heart. The third moment was hearing Sister Josephine Garrett's talk and how she said that discipleship—following Jesus "will wreck you, it will wreck your plans" it will cost us but looking at the difference between living for this life only or sharing in the life of Jesus for all eternity, it is worth the cost and in the end we see how His plan was way better than ours!

This conference began with Fellowship Of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) hosting it for college students around 27 years ago. I remember attending as a college freshman in 2003 and then again as a seminarian a couple years later. Wow has it grown! Today it serves to help provide an encounter with Jesus not only for college students but also for parishioners of all ages.
